## Town Hall Event to Update Public on Emerald Ash Borer

DATE: 3/16/2016

LINCOLN, Neb. — A virtual town hall meeting will take place March 22<sup>nd</sup> at 1:00 p.m. to address questions and concerns related to the emerald ash borer (EAB) in Nebraska. While the invasive insect hasn't been discovered in the state, the Nebraska Forest Service (NFS) and Cities of Lincoln and Omaha are encouraging communities and the public to better understand EAB and its widespread impacts.

"Whether you are a private property owner or a municipality, the planning process is the same. You need to identify ash trees, determine the value the trees offer, decide if the trees will be treated or removed, and then start weighing the options," said Lynn Johnson, Director of Lincoln Parks and Recreation. "However, the management approaches for each group aren't identical, and that's something we need to specifically address."

The town hall speakers will also look at the state of EAB in the Midwest, Nebraska's current legislative bills and proposals, as well as best practices for local governments and homeowners.

"This is an attempt to connect directly with Nebraskans not just in Lincoln, but around the state," said Nebraska's State Forester, Scott Josiah. "While EAB may not seem like an immediate threat, our state is in a unique position to get out ahead of the insect—something no other state has managed to do."
